# What is the FLRM?



FAO established the Forest and Landscape Restoration Mechanism (FLRM) in 2014 to help countries meet their ambitious pledges to restore degraded lands. Altogether, 350 million hectares of degraded land world-wide are targeted to be restored by 2030.



The FLRM provides support through knowledge management, innovative financing and resource mobilization, FLR monitoring and communication. It works in partnership with other institutions that support FLR through several regional and global initiatives.



The FLRM co-leads the Task Force on best practices of the UN Decade for Ecosystem Restoration

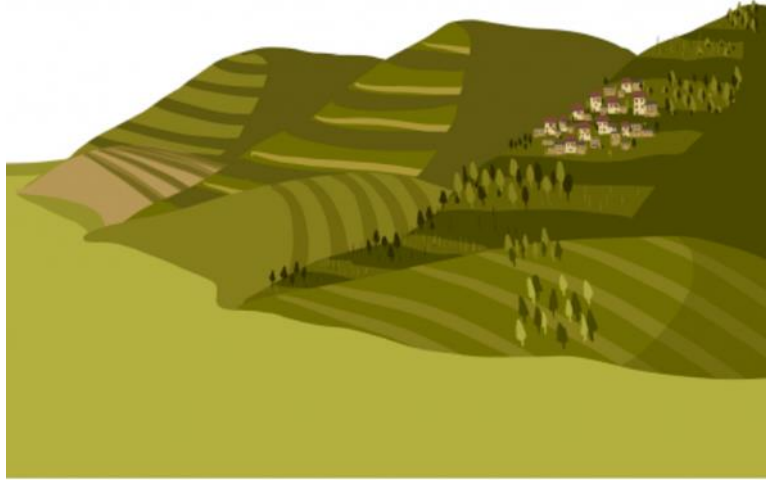

## Key facts and figures on Forest and Landscape Restoration

- 2 billion hectares of degraded land worldwide suitable for FLR
- 3.2 billion people globally are impacted by land degradation (LD)
- USD 9 trillion estimated net benefits from restoring 350 million hectares
- 700 million hectares of forests and lands could be restored only in Africa

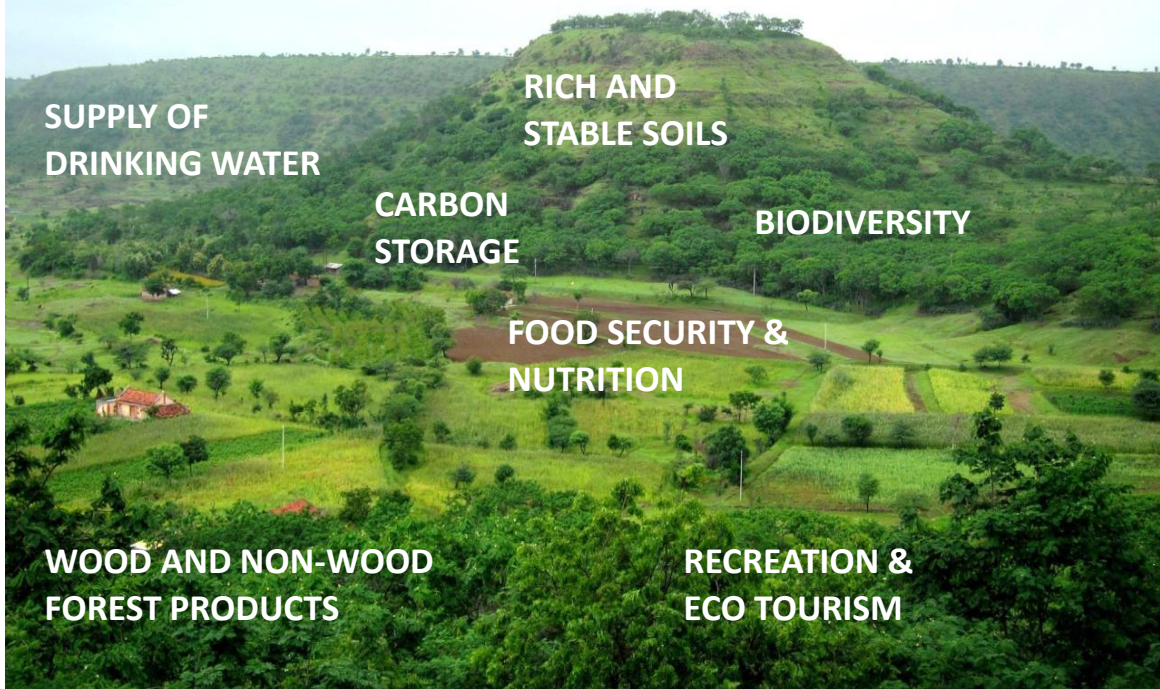

## What is Forest and Landscape Restoration ?

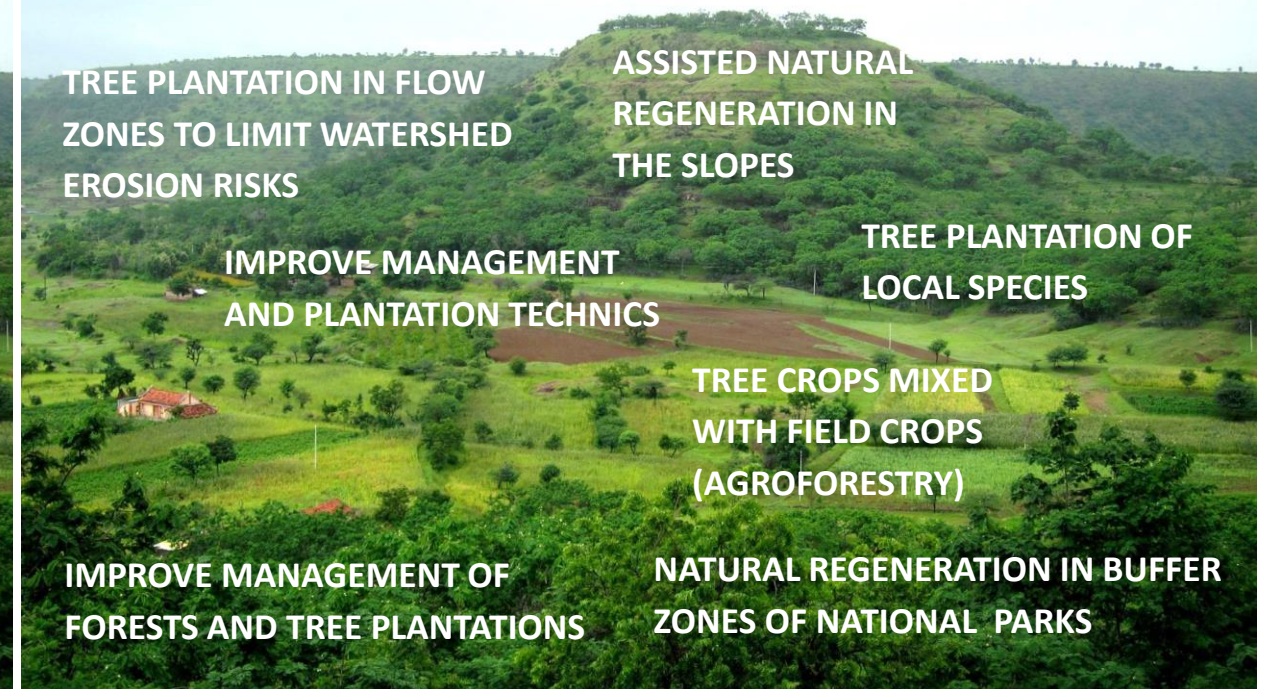

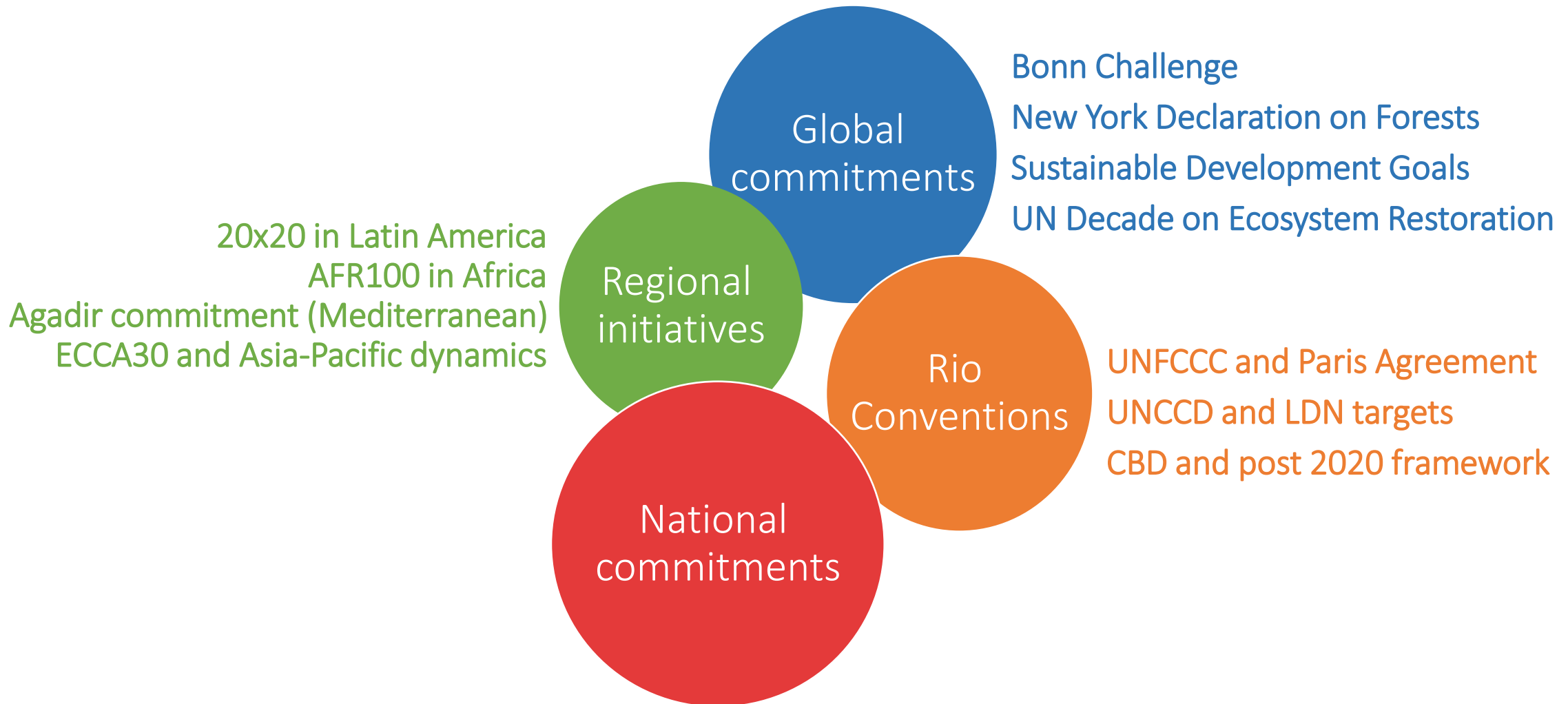

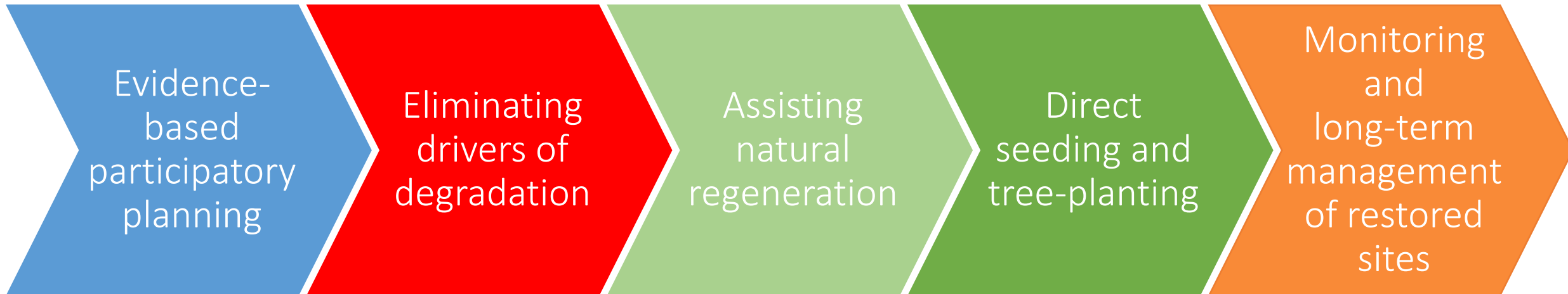

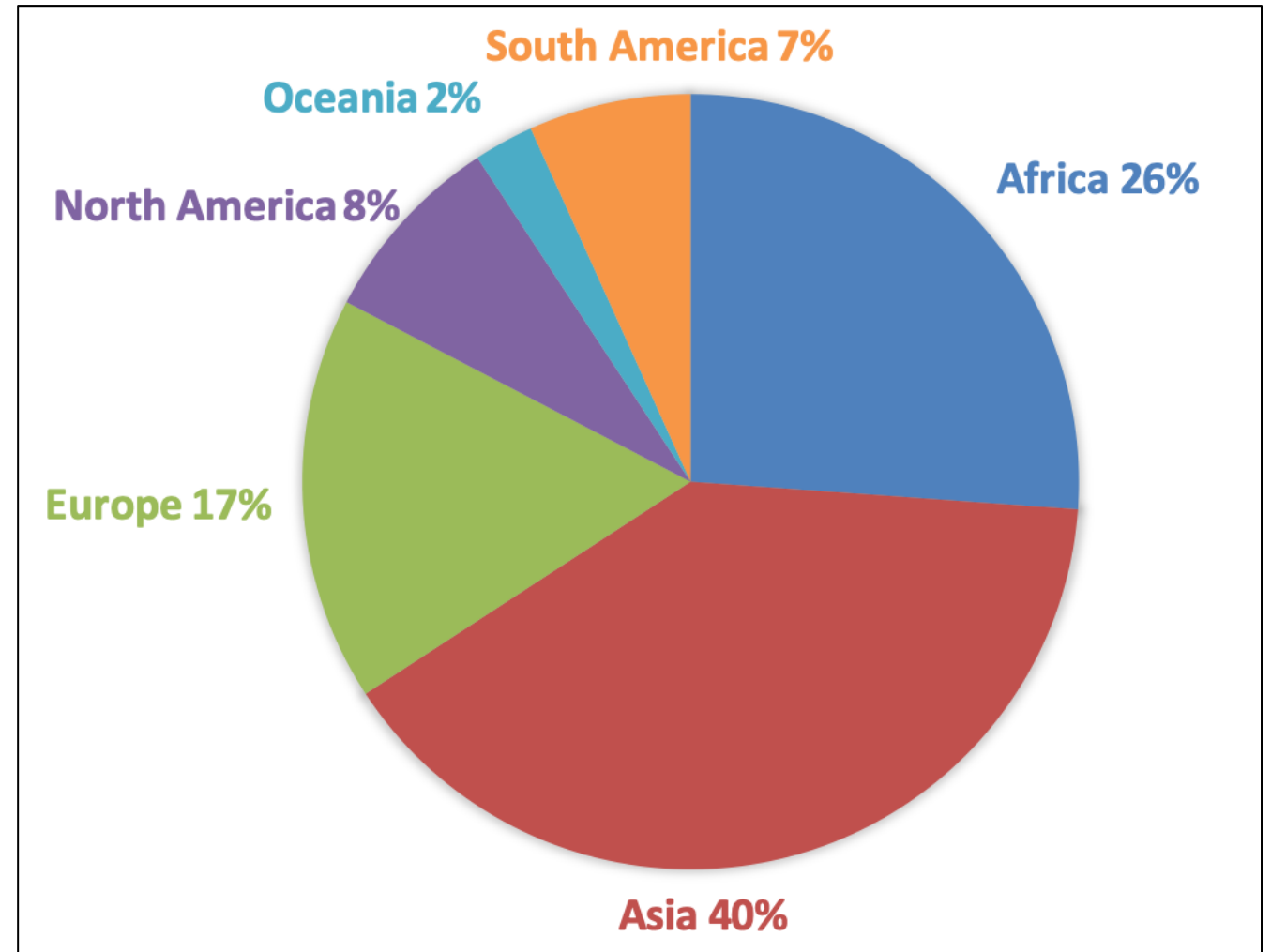

## Online access by region at the end of October 2021

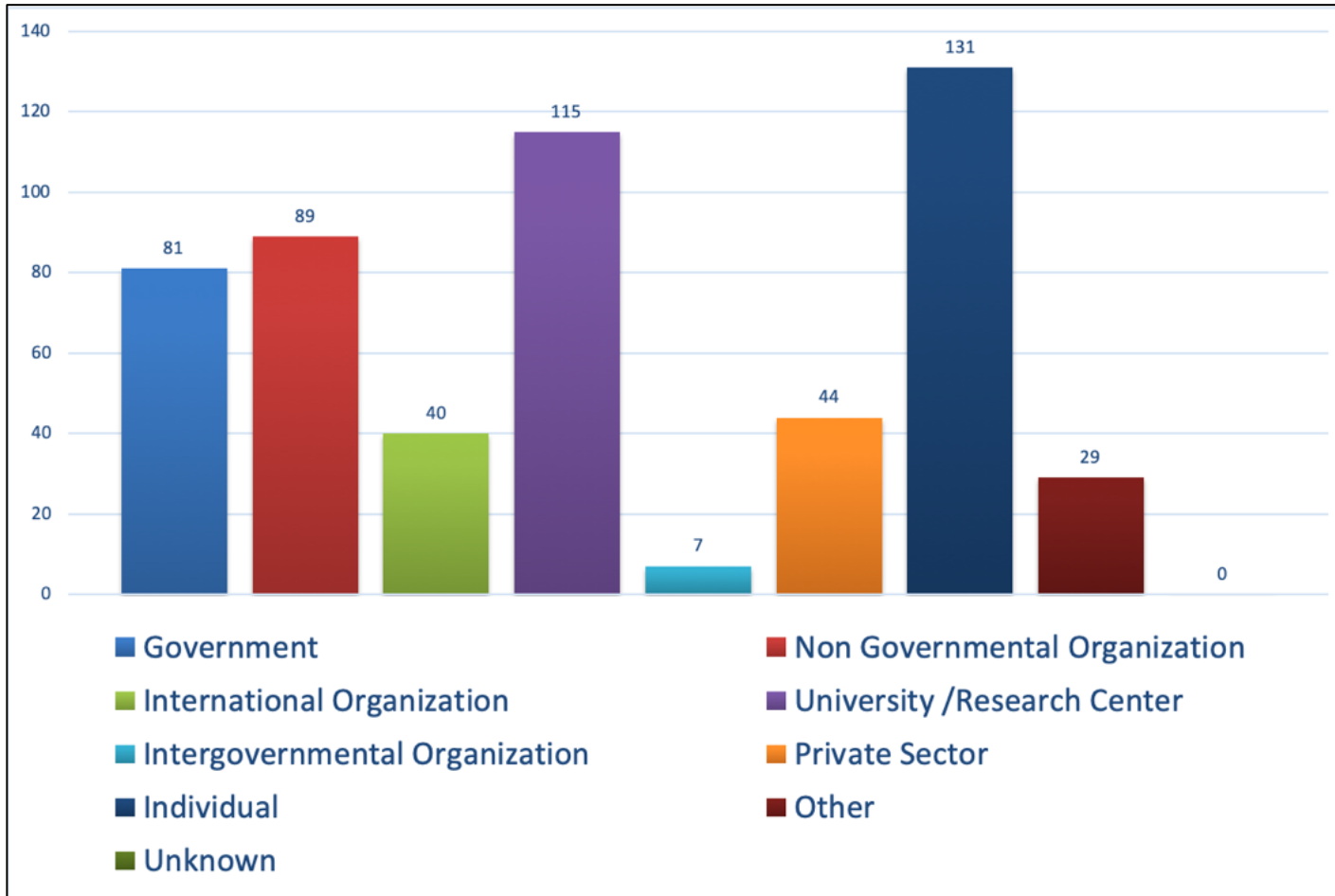
- Launch in June 2021 in English and in October 2021 in French

- 537 downloads since June 2021



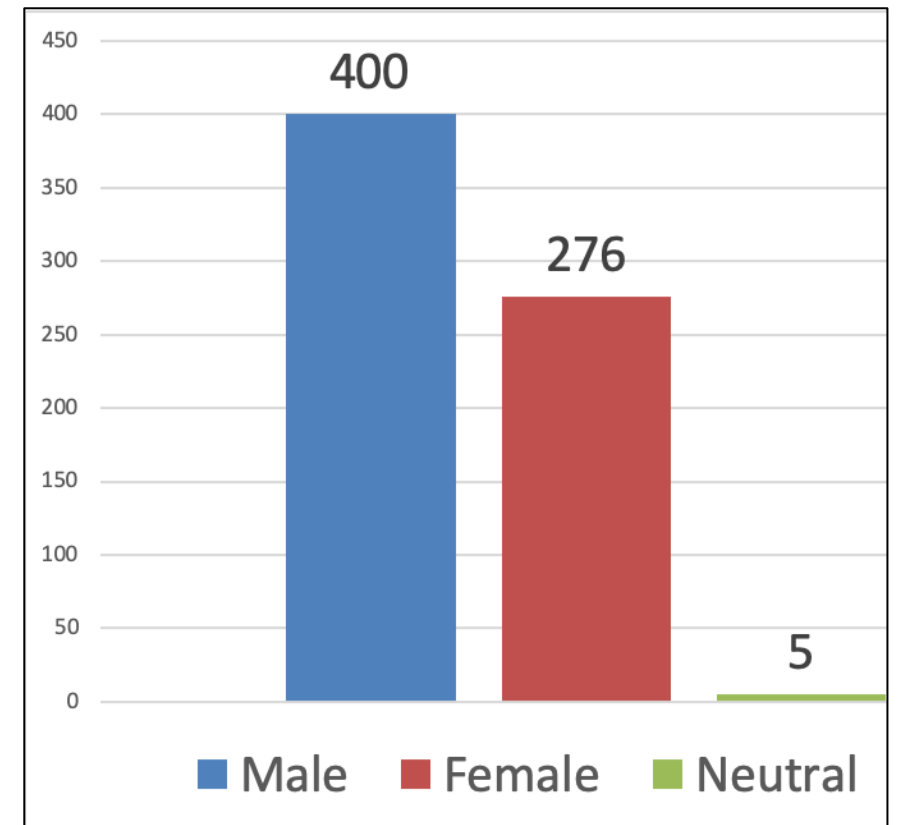
