Introduction

MAFAP monitoring activities have been implemented in Kenya since 2011 partnering with the Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organization (KALRO) and with the Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research and Analysis (KIPPRA) and collaborating with the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries, and Cooperatives (MoALF&Co)

Tracking Public Expenditure in Agriculture

→ Database on Agriculture Public Expenditures in support of Food and Agriculture from the 2006 to 2018



Policy Reform

- Analysis using the AgPE database has been used:
 - The Kenya Economic Report (KER) several issues this is KIPPRA Flagship annual report
 - Tracking progress of the Comprehensive Africa Agriculture Development Programme (CAADP) in the Biennial Review reports
 - Regional CAADP and National Joint Sector Reviews
 - In 2017 MAFAP, in collaboration with the Joint Research Center (JRC) of the EU, supported the drafting of the Agriculture Sector Growth and Transformation Strategy (ASGTS) and related National Agricultural Investment Plan (NAIP)

Lessons learned on methods and processes



LESSON LEARNED

MAIN ISSUES

- Domesticating MAFAP indicators to promote utilization
- Institutionalizing MAFAP among critical Ministries Agencies and Departments

- Difficulty in accessing disaggregated data
- Since devolution in 2013 the Agriculture spending happens at both levels of Government i.e (County and National level)

SOLUTIONS

- Encourage collaboration with relevant institutions to facilitate data collection
- Use the Integrated Financial Management Information System (IFMIS) as a source of disaggregated data
- Fast track the development of county- level MAFAP PE databases
