
Examples from the courses

Linkages between food security, nutrition and social protection

Given that poverty and malnutrition share many of the same structural drivers, social protection provides an effective strategy to simultaneously contribute to both poverty reduction and improved food security and nutrition.

In order to achieve food security, improved nutrition and healthy diets for all, coherent and complementary actions across agrifood systems need to be promoted.

Lately, the concept of food systems has gained importance, as it is increasingly recognized as central to all discussions around food security and nutrition.




State of Food Security and Nutrition 2021
